From the Bible Project

Shema: to listen

For thousands of years, every morning and evening, Jewish people have prayed these well-known words as a way of expressing their devotion to God, they're called the Shema.

"Hear O Israel, the LORD is our God, the LORD is one, and as for you, you shall love the LORD your God with all of your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength." Now the first word of the Shema is "hear," or "listen," which in Hebrew is pronounced shema. That's where the prayer gets its name.

To Listen

Now shema is a really common word in the Hebrew Bible, and it's obvious why. Hearing is a very universal activity. It's usually connected with the ear, as in Proverbs 20:12. "Ears that shema and eyes that see, the LORD has made them both."

Now that seems basic enough, but if you look at the other ways that Hebrew authors can use the word shema, they use it to mean more than just let sound waves enter your ear.

In Hebrew, shema can also mean pay attention to or focus on. So when Leah, who wasn't loved by her husband Jacob, she has a son and she names him Simon, or in Hebrew, Shim'on. Because, she says, "The LORD has shema that I am unloved."

To Respond

So shema means to hear and to pay attention to. And even more, it can also mean responding to what you hear.

This is why so many of the cries for help in the book of Psalms begin with a call that God listen. Psalm 27:7: "Shema my voice, when I call O LORD, be merciful, answer me." So asking God to shema is at the same time asking God to act, to do something.

It's similar to when God asks people to listen. Like when the people of Israel come to Mount Sinai, God says, "If you shema me fully and keep my covenant, then out of all the nations you will be my treasured possession." Now there's a couple interesting things about this verse in Exodus. In Hebrew the word shema is repeated twice in this sentence to give it emphasis, "if you shema shema," meaning listen closely.

But also notice that from God's point of view, listening is basically the same as keeping the covenant. So when God asks the people to shema, what he



means is that they listen and obey. And that's the last fascinating thing about shema. In ancient Hebrew, there is no separate word for obey, meaning to carry out the wishes of someone who knows better than you or is an authority over you. So in the Bible, if you want to say, "I will listen and do what you say," you use the single word shema. In Hebrew, listening and doing are two sides of the same coin.

This is why, later in Israel's history when the people were breaking their covenant promises to God, the Hebrew prophets would say things like, "They have ears, but they're not listening." 5 The Israelites of course could hear just

fine, but they weren't actually listening, or else they would act differently. And so in the end, listening in the Bible is about giving respect to the one speaking to you and doing what they say. Real listening takes effort and action. And that's the Hebrew word shema.

Shoebox Update October 2023

Since 1993, God has used Samaritan's Purse to deliver over 200 Million Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes to children in need and disciple 50 million of these boys and girls.

When Franklin Graham agreed to fill shoeboxes with toys and other fun items for children in war-torn Bosnia in 1993, he had no idea what the project would grow to become. Now this project has hundreds of thousands of volunteers and churches around the world who participate in spreading the Good News.

In addition to bringing joy to millions of boys and girls in need, gifts are accompanied by the booklet [translated into over 107 languages] called "The Greatest Gift". Many of these children have been invited to follow-up discipleship through The Mailbox Club [prior to 2009] and The Greatest Journey, the 12 week discipleship program designed especially for children. We praise God that over 50 million children have been discipled. In the past 14 years alone since The Greatest Journey was launched, over 17 million children have made decisions for Christ. You will be hearing more about this program and the goal the O.C.C. committee in our church has set for 2023.

Marina in Egypt: One of Many

In the coastal city of Alexandria, Marina, 11, attended an Operation Christmas Child outreach event where she received a gift-filled shoebox. Brimming with toys, a stuffed cat dressed in purple called "Bundle" was her favorite. "I love it very much" Marina said. She still keeps all the items inside to remind her of God's great love for her. In addition to opening her heart to God, the shoebox gift taught Marina a significant lesson about giving. She also learned about God's free gift of salvation at the outreach

gift-filled shoebox. Brimming with toys, a stuffed cat dressed in purple called "Bundle" was her favorite. "I love it very much" Marina said. She still keeps all the items inside to remind her of God's great love for her. In addition to opening her heart to God, the shoebox gift taught Marina a significant lesson about



giving. She also learned about God's free gift of salvation at the outreach event, she made a decision to give her heart to Jesus. "When I accepted Christ, it changed my whole life".

Marina went on to participate in follow-up discipleship lessons where she learned about how to follow her newfound Savior and share Him with others by studying 12 Bible stories including creation as well as Christ's crucifixion and resurrection. She said, "Each lesson I learned something new about God". Now seven years later, Marina teaches these same discipleship lessons to other shoebox recipients at her church. She does so because she desires others to have the same input in their lives as she received and called "Wonderful".

200 million plus shoeboxes delivered----50million plus boys and girls discipled----17 million plus decisions for Christ. PRAISE THE LORD!! But we must be careful to not get caught up in numbers. When I first started with O.C.C. [don't know what year] we did 20 boxes. Our goal for 2023 is 84 physical boxes and 16 ONLINE BOES. You'll hear more about these later. We seek God's will in deciding on these numbers for all that we do is to bring honor and glory to His Name. Thank you for your loyal support and many prayers. Prayer is what makes this program work. Sandy

Pumpkin dump cake!

There's been a lot of demand for this recipe!

1cup sugar. 3 whole eggs. 1 -13 oz can evaporated milk 1/2 tsp. Salt. 1 heaping tsp cinnamon , 1/2 heaping tsp cloves, 1/4 tsp nutmeg

2/3box yellow cake mix. 1 cup chopped pecans or walnuts 3/4 cup melted butter.

Mix together all ingredients except cake mix, melted butter and nuts. Pour into13x9 pan and cover with dry cake mix as smooth as you can. Sprinkle nuts over the top of the cake and drizzle melted butter on top.

Bake at 350 degrees for 55-60 minutes. Serve with whipping cream or just plain.

In place of spices you can use 3-tsps of pumpkin pie spices (I have always used the measured spices)

United Way of Lewis County (UWLC)

A number of us attended a Community Impact Luncheon organized by the United Way of Lewis County (UWLC). Their mission "To connect people and resources to improve the quality of Life in Lewis County" has a focus on children. They call this approach Cradle to Career and Beyond.

UWLC is supporting the Dolly Parton Imagination Library. Children from birth to age 5 that are enrolled in the program receive books mailed to their homes each month. The books are donated by Dolly Parton, who visited our County to kick off the program. UWCL is helping pay for the mailing. One of the publications made available by UWLC is a Calendar for Kindergarten Preparation. They are also sponsoring a reading program with Elementary School Children. In 2022-2023 6 Lewis County School Districts participated in the Reading Buddy program. There is also a mentorship program, including business attire. this partnership is between Women United and the Visiting Nurses Foundation. There is so much going on. The bold goal of UWLC is Lifting 30% out of Poverty by 2030.
