There were 3 students from the High School helping to stock the shelves, tubs, and coolers. The students also help carry groceries out to waiting cars. More on the Unreached People of Colombia

As you read in the February Gleaner, it's easier to pray for a people with which you are knowledgeable so this month we'll talk about the crime rate. As you know, at one time Colombia was considered one of the most dangerous countries in the world. Colombia's high crime rate is due to being a center for the cultivation and trafficking of cocaine. From the mid1960's to early 2000's, the civilian population was caught and often targeted by warring drug cartels and left-wing guerrillas such as the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia [FARC]. Massacres, disappearances, cases of torture, forced displacement, assassinations, "disappearances", kidnapping and extortion were common. Eventually, the government signed a peace agreement with FARC. Crime rate started to decline, especially the murder rate which is still among the highest in the world. Since the beginning of the crisis in Venezuela and the mass emigration of Venezuelan refugees, desperate Venezuelans have been recruited into gangs in order to survive. Venezuelan women have resorted to prostitution in order to make a living. Please remember that the people of Colombia are considered an Unreached People Group. This means that less than 5% of the population profess to be Christian and less than 2% are Evangelical Christians. I hope you saved your Prayer Points from the February Gleaner. These people desperately need the Gospel Of Jesus Christ. Please turn your light on and pray each day for this people group. John 9:4, "We must work for the works of Him who sent me while it is day; NIGHT IS COMING, WHEN NO ONE CAN WORK". Our work is to be prayer warriors. 

Let me say a word or two about food bank donations. Session has approved budgeting 85 dollars per month to the Toledo Neighbor's Program and 80 dollars per month to the Winlock/Vader Food Bank. If you want to contribute to that effort, note "food bank" on the memo line of your check or offering envelope. Those monies will be saved for a period of time and then sent as a special gift to one of our local food banks as approved by Session.

Great News Of Great Joy

You might have heard last Sunday the wonderful news contained in the article below, but just in case......

The news is just in—11.3 million shoeboxes were collected the year (that number does not include the online shoeboxes that were ordered) and are in the process of distribution. Ten million of those boxes came from the United States. 400,000 of those boxes were delivered to the children in the war torn county of Ukraine. This monumental effort to bless the children, and their families, in need around the world with great joy and the Good News of



Jesus Christ would not be possible without a global effort and giving churches like ours. Thank you so for your support and I know that God will continue to bless our efforts to spread the gospel.

The Greatest Journey

(From Franklin Graham's January update newsletter)

"As I write this, more than 11 million Operation Christmas Child shoebox gifts are just beginning their journey— Crossing oceans, mountains and deserts—to delight children in more than 100 countries around the world." We had the privilege to participate in this wonderful endeavor by prayerfully packing our boxes and by praying and praises Him for using each box to His glory. The Bible tells us that God's Word will not return in vain.

As children receive their gifts, they are eligible to start another journey; The Greatest Journey of many of their lives. Over the past 30 years, more than 50 million children have been have been reached through the program and 25 million have prayed to recieve Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.

The Greatest Journey consists of 12 discipleship classes which are led by a trained volunteer teachers. O.C.C. provides materials in 91 languages. Each child receives a workbook and at the completion of the course, each child receives a New Testament in his/her own language. 36 million New Testaments have been awarded.

For many, these are the first books of their own and are very precious to them and not only because they contain the Word of God but also because they are their own. As with all of Samaritan's Purse evangelistic outreaches, support does not go away at the completion of the program. Many of the graduates go on to become pastors, Sunday School teachers and trained volunteers to lead the TGJ program.

In Mongolia, many children grow up in a culture that is animistic- a doctrine that organic development is dues to a sport or a phenomena of nature that inanimate objects. Munkhbold, a student, was so excited when he learned that he was so special in God's eyes because he was created in God's image. The first lesson TGJ is from Genesis 1:27: "So God created man in His own image: in the image of God He created them; male and female He created them". It is often hard for us to fathom the joy that these children receive the Word of God telling them they are special. Often we take this for granted.

Please continue to pray that the O.C.C. shoeboxes and the GREATEST JOURNEY will continue to reach the hearts of the children in many countries that welcome these programs. These children are the future spiritual leaders in their individual countries. Pray for the night is coming. Blessings, Sandy

The Determining Factor

And if Christ is not risen, then our preaching is empty and your faith is also empty. 1 Corinthians 15:14

According to the Pew Research Center, Christians who attend church only at Christmas and Easter are sometimes called "Chreasters." They also note that online searches for "church" peak during those two holidays with Easter being the dominant season. *See footnote

Easter is by far the oldest of the two observances since "the Lord's Day" (Revelation 1:1) --- the day of Christ's resurrection---was observed as a day for meeting and celebration soon after the Resurrection. And well it should have been, for the apostle Paul wrote that the resurrection of Christ is the determining factor in Christianity. Without the Resurrection, our preaching and our faith are all in vain. (1 Corinthians 15:14, 17-19). Without the Resurrection, the faith that has changed the world is without foundation. No wonder Easter is the most-attended service at churches every year.

As you celebrate the Resurrection this Lord's Day, praise God that your faith and hope are not in vain---because He is risen!


Turning Point
